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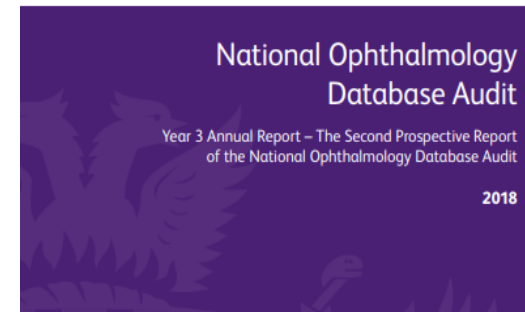
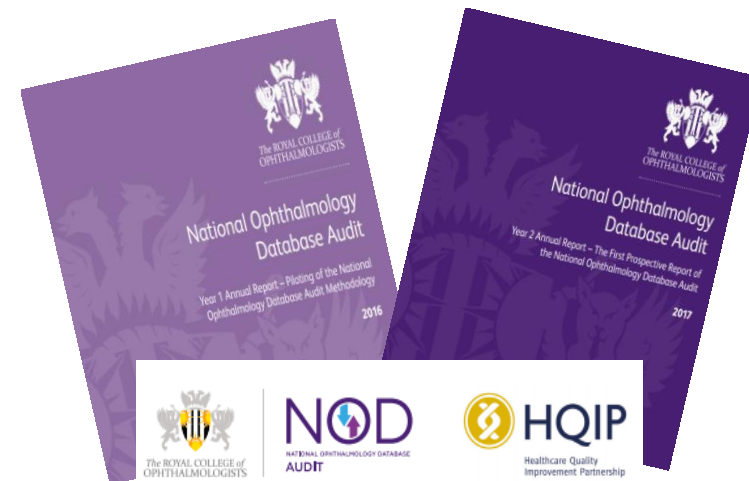
NOD Audit Project Support Officer

- Sustainable funding required post HQIP period

Successes of the NOD

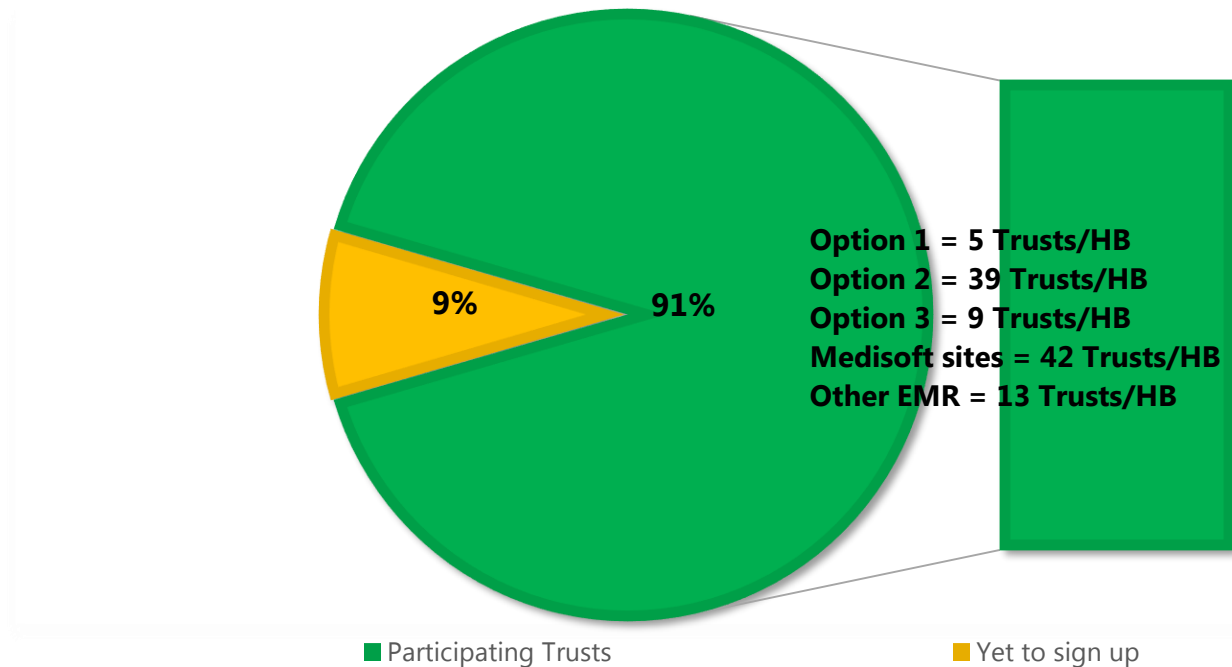
- Free Electronic Medical Record (EMR) system was offered to centres until August 2019
- Published three annual reports

- Participation fee from contributing centres

Future plans for NOD Audit



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- Include private organisations
- Involve devolved nations (NI, Scotland & Channel Islands)
- Possibly expand the NOD to include a national audit on AMD and other fields of ophthalmology

Future plans for NOD Audit

- Collection of PROMs data
- Change data collection period
 - extend period initially to 18 months and then to 2 years
- Move away from % rates to sample size independent metric

Future plans for NOD Audit



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- Collect Patient Identifiable Data (PID)
- More frequent reporting
